Your journey to 7th grade begins now! Over the summer, you will be expected to read the novel *Stargirl*. The expectations for the summer reading will be the completion of **two** assignments, which will be handed in when you return to school on **September 7, 2022**. You will be completing a creative assignment **AND** a writing assignment. You will be able to choose your assignments from the options given below. Attached are two scoring rubrics. The rubrics will be used to determine your grade. The rubrics are the expectations for the assignment. Any questions on the assignments can be directed to your reading teacher or Mr. Deodino.

Assignment One: Creative Options

Please complete **one** of following options:

- 1.) **Book in a bag:** Choose 10 items that represent people, places, conflicts, and/or events that occurred within your book. Place them in a brown bag. Create a label for your bag that includes the title and author. Create a key describing each of the items and explain their importance to the story. **Your key must be typed on a word document.**

- 2.) **Quote Mural:** Select your top five quotes from the novel. Display these quotes in the form of a mural drawing. Display your artistic representation of the quotations within your mural. Give a brief explanation why these quotes were selected. This explanation must be typed on word document. Some examples of quotes you may use are:

- “She laughs when there was no joke. She danced when there was no music.”
- “We did not know what to make of her. In our minds we tried to pin her like a corkboard like a butterfly, but the pin merely went through and away she flew.”
- “On the contrary, she is one of us. Most decidedly. She is us more than we are us. She is, I think, who we really are. Or were.”
- “You’ll know her more by your questions than by her answers. Keep looking at her long enough. One day you might see someone you know.”

3.) **Character Interview:** Create a short video (3 to 4 minutes) of you interviewing a character of your choice from the story. Ask questions relating to the novel which give the character’s point of view about the story. Make sure the video file will be able to be shared with your teacher upon completion of your video.

4.) **Diary:** Write a diary entry that one of the story’s main characters may have kept before, during, or after the book’s events. You must include the character’s thoughts and feelings in the diary. At least three diary entries are required. Each diary entry must be 7-10 sentences long. All entries must be typed on a word document.

5.) **Test:** Write a test for the book you read. Use information from the book to create a test that you could give to other readers to check their understanding/comprehension of the story. The test must include matching, multiple choice, and short response questions. It must also contain a vocabulary section. This section must include 7-10 unfamiliar words you came across while reading. In total, your test must be between 20-25 questions and equal to 100 points. Your test must also include an answer key which includes the answers to all questions. All work must be completed on a word document.

6.) **PowerPoint:** Create a PowerPoint (6-10 slides) representing your book. Include pictures/backgrounds/color/animations to enhance your project.

Your project must include:

1. Title, author, publication date
2. Main character list complete with physical traits and personality descriptions
3. A description of the setting
4. Favorite quote or part of the book with a 1 paragraph explanation of why it's your favorite

5. A one paragraph book review with a 1-5-star rating and short explanation of why the book received the chosen rating

Assignment Two: Writing Options

Please complete **one** of the following options:

All writing prompts must be completed in a minimum of 5 paragraph essays. Please complete the prompt on a word document and remember to quote the text properly in your writing piece.

- 1.) **Character Comparison** - Choose a character from Stargirl and compare it to another character from a DIFFERENT novel or story you have read. Please make sure to include their similarities and differences in your writing.
- 2.) **Narrative Writing Option** - Complete or change a portion of the novel.
- 3.) **Opinion Writing Option** - Individuality is an important theme throughout the novel. In your opinion, which character do you think embodies individuality the most? Make sure you include reasons why and use text evidence to support your opinion.
- 4.) **Persuasive Writing Option** - Write a persuasive essay to convince students that Stargirl is a positive asset to Mica Area High School.
